#### NICENE CREED

Presider: May God be with you.

All: By your will, they were created and have your being.


Presider: From the primal elements, you brought forth the human race, and blessed us with the capacity for memory, reason, and skill. You made us the stewards of your creation. But we turned against you, and betrayed your trust: and we turned against one another.

All: Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.

Presider: Again and again, you called us to return. Through prophets and sages, you revealed your righteous Law. And in the fullness of time you sent your eternal Word, born of your servant Mary, to fulfill your law, opening us for the way of freedom and peace.

All: By his blood, he reconciled us. By his wounds, we are healed.

Presider: And therefore we praise you, joining with the heavenly chorus, with prophets, martyrs, and with all those in every generation who have looked to you in hope, to proclaim with them your glory, in their unending hymn:



Presider: On the night he was betrayed Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given up for you. Do this in remembrance if me." After supper, Jesus took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said, "Drink this, all of you; This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

Remembering now his work of redemption and offering to you this sacrifice of thanksgiving.

All: We celebrate Christ's death and resurrection as we await the day of his coming.

Holy, Holy

Presider: Therefore, O God, we who have been redeemed by Jesus Christ, and made a new people by water and the Spirit, now bring before you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ our Savior.

*Presider:* Sanctify us also, and let the grace of this Holy Communion make us one body, one spirit in Christ, that we may worthily serve the world in his name.

Risen Lord, be known to us in the breaking of the Bread.

Presider: God of our ancestors; Redeemer and Mother of Israel; God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ: open our eyes to see your hand at work in the world about us. Deliver us from the presumption of coming to this table for solace only and not for strength, for pardon only and not for renewal.

Accept these prayer and praises, Almighty God, through Jesus Christ our great High Priest, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, your Church gives honor, glory and worship, from generation to generation.



Come. It is Christ who invites us to meet him here.


*Presider:* The Gifts of God for the people of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with Thanksgiving.
