Happy 2025 and welcome to Epiphany Season at Nativity

We welcome you to our Sunday Worship at Nativity Episcopal Church. As we gather weekly for formation, worship, community and good coffee and conversation, here are some tidbits of information about our liturgical season of Epiphany.

First, the formal one:

Epiphany Season:

A season of four to nine weeks, from the Feast of the Epiphany (Jan. 6) through the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday. The length of the season varies according to the date of Easter. The gospel stories of this season describe various events that manifest the divinity of Jesus. The coming of the Magi is celebrated on the Epiphany. The Baptism of our Lord is observed on the Sunday after Epiphany. The gospels for the other Sundays of the Epiphany season describe the wedding at Cana, the calling of the disciples, and various miracles and teachings of Jesus. The Last Sunday after the Epiphany is always devoted to the Transfiguration. Jesus' identity as the Son of God is dramatically revealed in the Transfiguration gospel, as well as the gospel of the baptism of Christ. We are called to respond to Christ in faith through the showings of his divinity recorded in the gospels of the Epiphany season. (episcopalchurch.org)

Now, the less formal one:

This year, Nativity celebrated the Epiphany on January 5 and the Epiphany Season is about as long as it can be – it includes 9 Sundays and runs until March 4 (the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday). Lent officially begins on Wednesday, March 5 (we will have noon and 7pm services). If you are wondering, Easter is April 20:).

Throughout this season, you will hear stories from Luke's Gospel about the daily life of Jesus. The liturgical color of the season is Green, a time of growth (even in the deep MN winter). Epiphany means Manifestation or Insight and while it begins with the Magi seeing Jesus and Jesus welcoming them, the season gives us opportunities to hear the stories of Jesus' followers and how they "see" him differently. How God comes alive to them as they learn from him, journey with him, pray with him and share the Good News.

NICENE CREED

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Presider: Therefore, according to his command, O Father,




